Fort McMurray Forklift License - Getting a forklift certification or forklift license within North America will require the one training to carry out classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The state, provincial and federal regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators could acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machine which is designed together with numerous options, such as sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and a wide variety of sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of workers. Operator training courses are usually individualized in order to deal with the certain types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck in a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift within a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on specific course requirements but rather on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common method of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to provide classroom sessions and practical training on machines at their place of work. Employers could opt to train workers on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation procedures, forklift maintenance, safety procedures and company regulations. Topics particular to the worksite, such as dangerous conditions or materials, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each type of lift truck on the worksite.

When utilizing a third party trainer, the certification process would usually consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It should be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training permits the operator to run a forklift for that employer only.

The most significant factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one type of machine to another. Safety issues differ from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, such as in marine and offshore operations.
